Choral

- All classes are non-competitive
- Participation certificates will be given for all performances
- Recommendation to provincials at the adjudicator's discretion

Vocal

AWARDS

- Awards will be presented to the winner of each class provided the mark is 80% or higher;
- Single entry performers will receive a merit certificate provided the mark is 80% or higher;
- Entrants must receive 80% or higher to qualify for a trophy;
- Scholarships may be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and committee members and will be awarded at the awards night at the conclusion of festival week.

REGULATIONS

- Rules in the Provincial Syllabus apply unless expanded or modified by a local rule. See the Winkler Festival of the Arts Addendum;
- Participants must number the first measure of each line of their music, in all copies, prior to the beginning of their class;
- Video or audio taping must be unobtrusive and silent. Adjudications must not be recorded under any circumstances;
- If a performer cannot attend at the scheduled time, request for changes must be submitted in writing to the appropriate committee 48 hours prior to the scheduled performance time.

AWARDS & CERTIFICATES

- All Beginner and Grade 1 classes are non-competitive. Each entrant to receive a merit certificate.
- Grade 2 and up to receive a certificate with a Gold, Silver, or Bronze seal based on mark achieved.
- If a “GOLD” performance, single entrants of a class to receive a rosette ribbon and compete at AWARDS NIGHT.
- The best “GOLD” performance in a multiple entry class to receive a rosette ribbon and compete at AWARDS NIGHT.
- Where the competitor in a given piano level wins more than one class, the competitor will only be allowed to enter ONE class at AWARDS NIGHT. The title and composer of the piece needs to be forwarded to the Piano Festival Committee by 9:00 a.m. on Friday, April 21, 2023.

REGULATIONS

- Rules in the Provincial Syllabus apply unless expanded or modified by a local rule. See Winkler Festival of the Arts addendum.
- Participants must number the first measure of each line of their music, in all copies, prior to the beginning of their class.
- Entrants are reminded that they must provide original copies of selections for the adjudicator and themselves. Proof of purchase required for online purchases.

SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES (AMOUNT VARIES BY GRADE)

- Recipient must have competed in a minimum of two classes (one being a recognized grade level list piece).
- Grades two and up are eligible for scholarships.
- Recipient must display a high standard of musicianship and outstanding performances (e.g. mannerism, poise, and attitude).
- Scholarships may be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and the committee members and will be awarded at the AWARDS NIGHT at the conclusion of festival week.

ADJUDICATOR'S CHOICE SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES (\$100)

- Recipient must have competed in a minimum of two classes (pieces must be of contrasting styles).
- Entrants of any level are eligible.
- Recipient must display a high standard of musicianship and outstanding performances (e.g., mannerism, poise, and attitude).
- The festival encourages the use of this scholarship towards private music lessons, tuition at music camps, purchase of music or any other area which would further artistic development.
- Scholarships will be awarded at the discretion of the adjudicator and the committee at AWARDS NIGHT.

Vocal/Choral Sessions April 19, 2023 Adjudicator: Millie Hildebrand



Millie Hildebrand has enjoyed a life-long involvement in the vocal and choral arts, beginning on the family farm where singing was a daily affair and piano and guitars were always within reach.

Familiar to Manitoba's music community as a teacher, choral director, voice instructor and festival adjudicator, she has taught classroom and choral music at all levels, and has been active in implementing programs for young musicians throughout the province. These have included collaborations with the University of Manitoba, the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, the International Peace Gardens Music Camps, regional and provincial honour choirs, numerous choir tours, and countless musicals. Millie was the conductor of the Faith and Life Women's Chorus for seven years and co-conducted the UofM Concert Choir, together with her husband Ed, for four years, where they also worked with music teacher candidates as their Faculty Advisors. Choirs under Millie's direction have toured extensively in Canada and Europe, and have been privileged to be the guests of such luminaries as the late Queen Elizabeth II, Jose Carreras and, perhaps their favourites ---- Fred Penner and Al Simmons!

Going back "a few years", Millie's performance history includes productions with Manitoba Opera, Winnipeg Mennonite Theatre, the Oregon Bach Festival Chorus and Canzona, to name a few. A two-year teaching post in Bucharest, Romania provided an exhilarating adventure into the art and culture of Eastern Europe.

Millie is co-president of the Women's Musical Club of Winnipeg and has enjoyed a lengthy involvement with the Manitoba Choral Association. She looks forward to working with the Wpg. 1 S.D. Grade 4-6 Honour Choir in May, and to joining other conductors at the Centennial Concert Hall in an event this July, commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the Russian Mennonite Emigration to Canada.

Tracey is currently a piano instructor at Canadian Mennonite University and the Community School of Music and the Arts. She has also been an avid piano and theory instructor over the last twenty years, maintaining large teaching studios in her home in Winnipeg, Edmonton, Illinois, Ohio, and Paraguay. She has also developed a career adjudicating, giving masterclasses and accompanying a variety of soloists and choirs. After winning the Saskatchewan Valley Rose Bowl as a young pianist, Tracey moved to Winnipeg to attend Canadian Mennonite Bible College where she received her Bachelors in Church Music, Piano Performance. She continued her piano studies in Waterloo, ON, receiving her Honours Bachelor of Music with High Distinction in Piano Performance from Wilfrid Laurier University. Tracey also studied vocal and instrumental accompanying in Waterloo, as well as piano pedagogy at the Beckett School of Music in Ontario. Tracey's students have achieved top honours with the Royal Conservatory of Music in piano and theory examinations and have won at the Piano Concerto Competition held annually by the University of Manitoba Preparatory Studies.

Tracey is an active member of the Manitoba Registered Music Teachers Association, the Canadian Music Teacher's Association, and is an active adjudicator with the Associated Manitoba Arts Festivals.

When Tracey is not teaching or accompanying, she spends her time travelling, gardening, and spending time with her husband, David, and daughter Mikayla.
